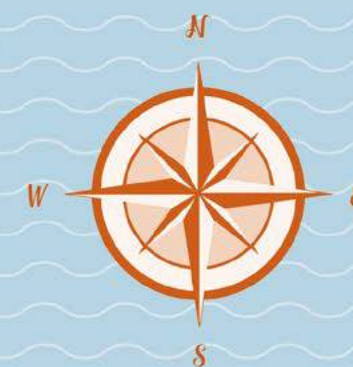

Situated just 684km from Rome, the Maltese islands are comprised of: Malta, the largest island at 312 km<sup>2</sup>; Gozo & Comino, the two smaller islands. Malta's official languages are Maltese and English, however, Italian is also widely spoken. Malta has been part of the Eurozone since 2008, their currency is Euro. The islands boast a typically Mediterranean almost tropical climate, characterised by hot dry summers and mild winters with a brief rainy season. The island comprises of countless historical sites including the Megalithic temples, fortifications, Baroque cathedrals and palaces.

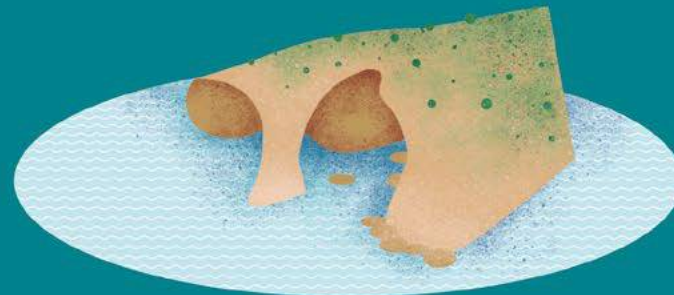
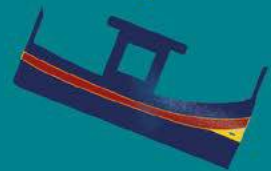
## MALTA'S FILM SET
